

Cooperative with Atlantic Cape Community College

The **Shore Medical Center School of Radiologic Technology (SMCSRT)** is a full-time, 21-month *certificate program* in Radiologic Technology. Through participation in classroom, laboratory, and clinical activities, students are prepared to successfully begin a career as a **Radiologic Technologist**. The program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), Bureau of X-ray Compliance.

SMCSRT program graduates are awarded a *Certificate of Program Completion*, which along with the possession of an associate's degree or higher will allow them to apply for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) Examination. Upon successful completion of the examination, graduates may apply for New Jersey State licensure.

Shore Medical Center School of Radiologic Technology (SMCSRT) and **Atlantic Cape Community College (ACCC)** have a cooperative agreement. This cooperative enables applicants who do not possess a degree to complete the certificate program provided by SMCSRT, while completing the general education courses required for associate degree completion via ACCC.

Completion of any pre-requisite or general education classes does not guarantee acceptance into the Radiology School.

Applicants, who have at minimum, successfully completed the four pre-requisite general education courses (Anatomy and Physiology I and II, English composition 101, and a math course - College algebra, Statistics, or pre-calculus) would be eligible to apply for admission to Shore Medical Center School of Radiologic Technology. These courses are part of the total general education requirements for a degree. (Please see handbook for additional admission process requirements)

Once all program and degree requirements are successfully completed, the student is eligible to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technology (ARRT) examination in Radiography.

*Students who are accepted into SMCSRT who already hold an associate's degree or higher, will be required to become a **Visiting Student** at ACCC in order to complete three program courses (Patient Care I and II, along with Radiation Physics).
